Spring 2	Fiction and Non-fiction Charles Dickens Collection – Dickens as a Child/ Dickens and the poor	Analysis of 19 <sup>th</sup> century fiction and non-fiction texts by Charles Dickens	Watch any modern films based on texts written in 19 <sup>th</sup> century e.g. A Christmas Carol, Water Babies. Encourage child to research who Charles Dickens is, books he wrote. Discuss and research what life was like in 19 <sup>th</sup> century.
